THE Barling Race Bowl, for so many years the centre of Southend Cycle Speedway, is to close at the end of December.*

Estuary Eagles, who made their home there since their formation in September, 1959, have been given two months notice to find a new home.

Already negotiations have taken place for a future home of the Eagles and a new track will be named by the end of the month.

The final meeting at Barling will probably be on Sunday, December 18th, when an all-star meeting of top Essex riders will battle for the Farewell Trophy.

The return match against Tottenham Kangeroos will take place at Tottenham Marshes on Sunday, December 4th.

The Yallop Trophy semi-final (second leg) between Estuary Eagles and East Ham Stars, was postponed due to the Barling track being flooded. The Estuary Committee decided to let the London club take the match and meet East Ham Wolves in the final.

On Sunday Estuary Eagles "C" wind up their Association Cup fixtures with a double header against East Ham Stars "C" and Hawbush Hammers "C." A win against both will give the Southend club their first "pot" of the season.

Assisting the Eagles in their winter programme will be former Sutton Saints and Barling Brigands rider, Roland Mann.
